







What Enrollment Challenges Is the Region Facing?







Postsecondary Enrollment by Age, U.S. vs. New England: 2016












Key Headwinds for New England:

Birth Rate in New England compared to other U.S. regions – low birth rate holds steady

Immigration

Migration AWAY from New England and Northeast



Some Good News for the Northeast

- Children from the Northeast 40% more likely to attend college than their Western and South Central counterparts.
- Children from New England 10x more likely to attend a Top 50 university than their Western and South Central counterparts.
- High % of families with \$100k+ household income + degreeholding parents





Higher Demand Index - Overview and Use

2 sets of info used to calculate:

- 1. # of 18 year-olds in geographic location in given year
- 2. Share of those students likely to attend college

Projected decline in community college enrollment in New England, 2025-2029

Projected decline in overall college enrollment (2- and 4year) in New England, 2025 onward



Higher Demand Index, cont.

Sector	Projections	
2-Year Institutions	 2% national increase through 2025, followed by sharp decline 13% decrease by 2029 15%+ decline in New England 	
4-Year Institutions	 Modest (2%) growth until 2025, then steep decline 2025-2029: projected loss of 280,000 students nationally New England net decline of 25% 	
Overall	 Population growth shifting to Southwest, especially Hispanic population 2025-2030: college-going population shrinking by 450,000
