

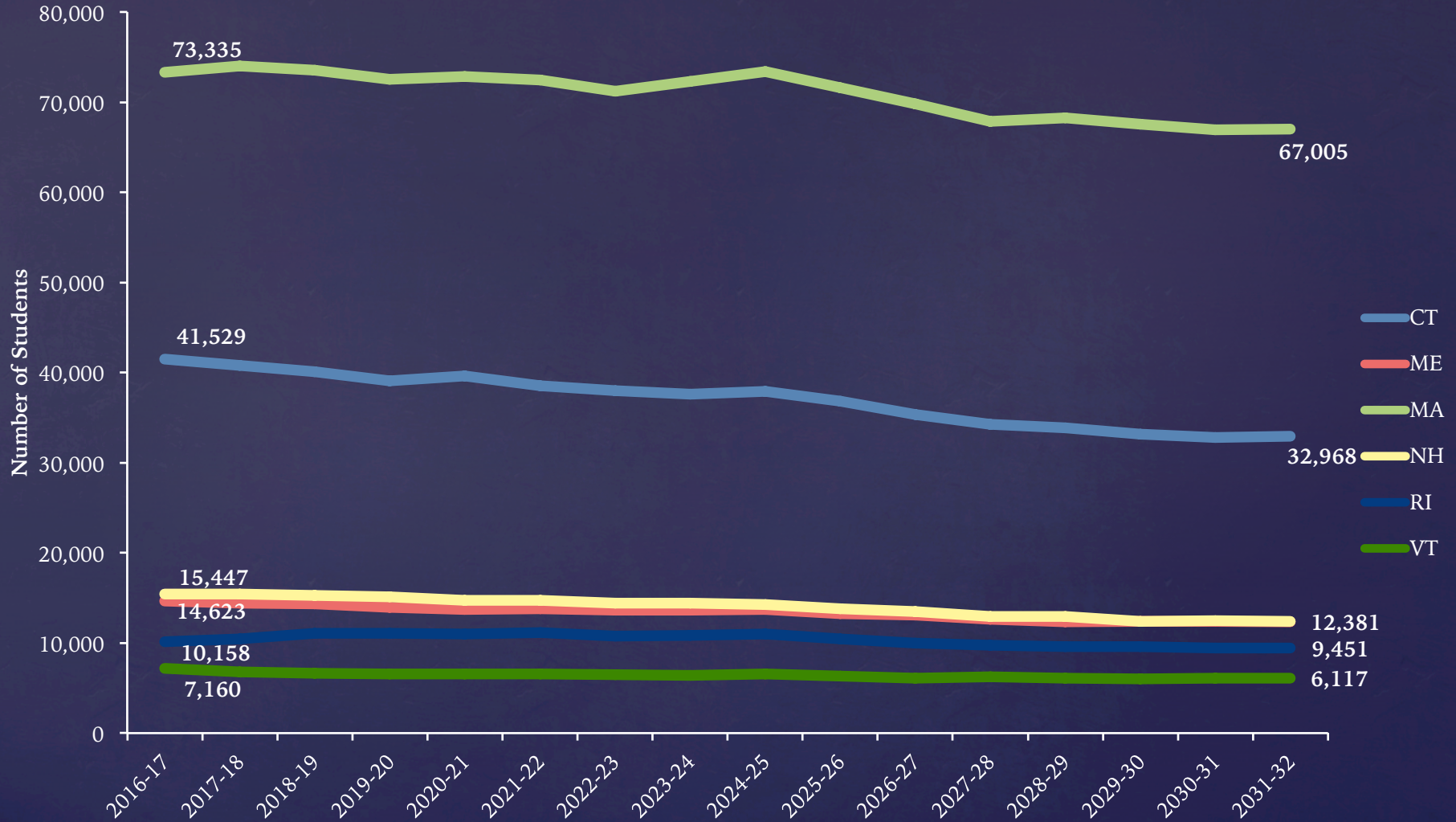

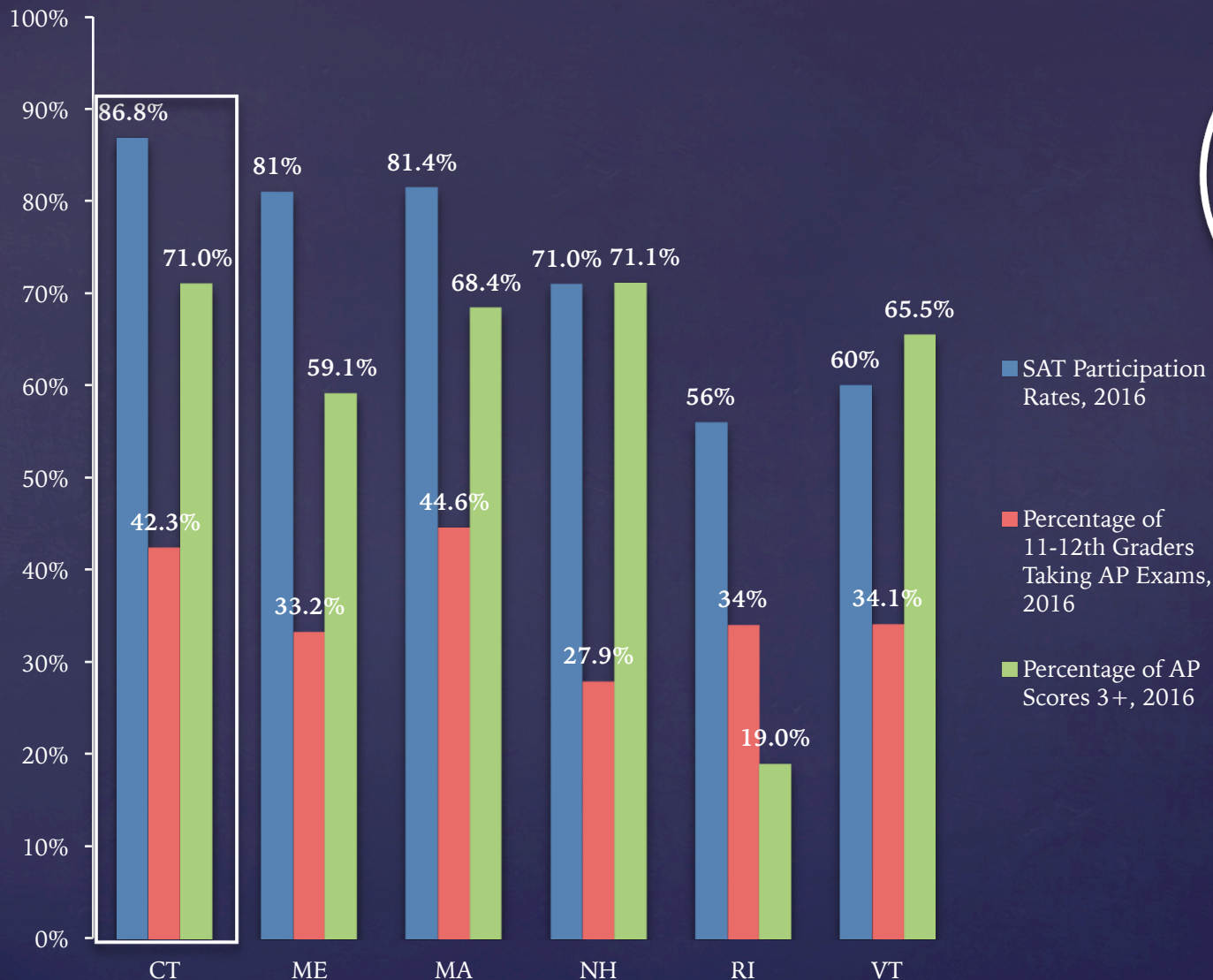


Projected High School Graduates: By State

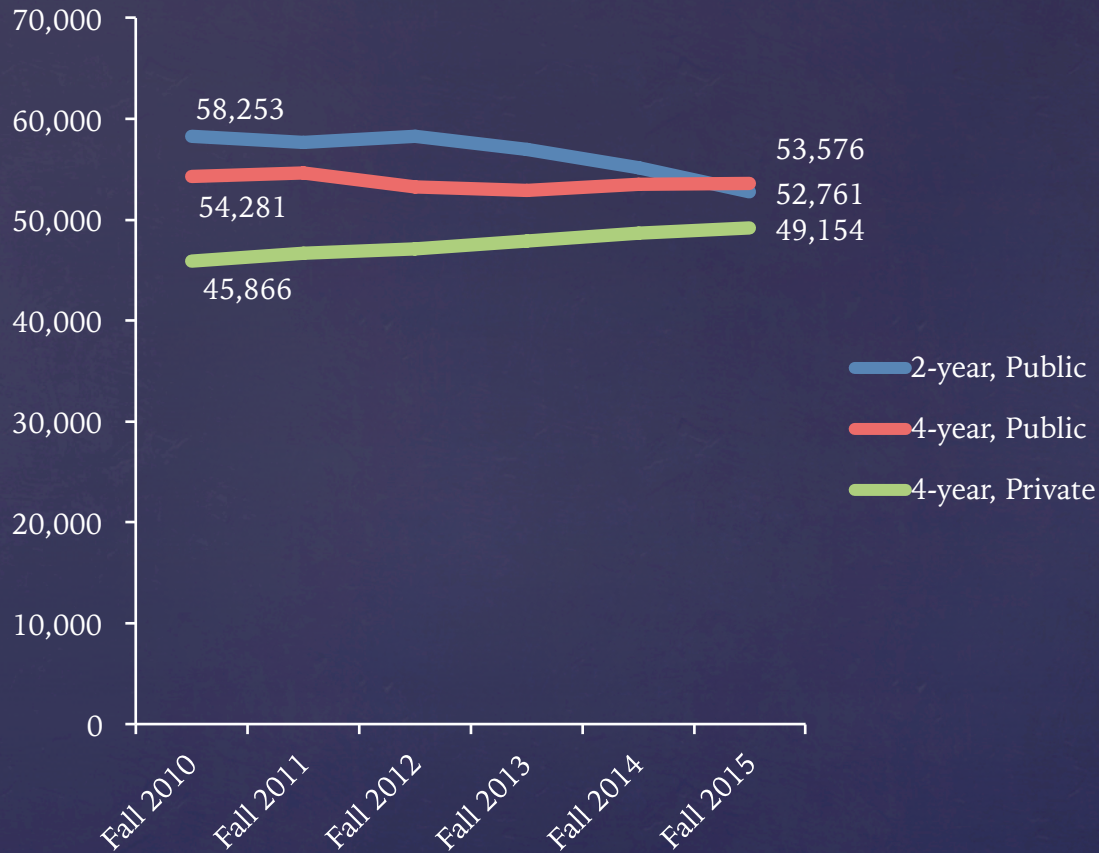


In 2016, 68.1% of Connecticut's high school graduates enrolled in higher education

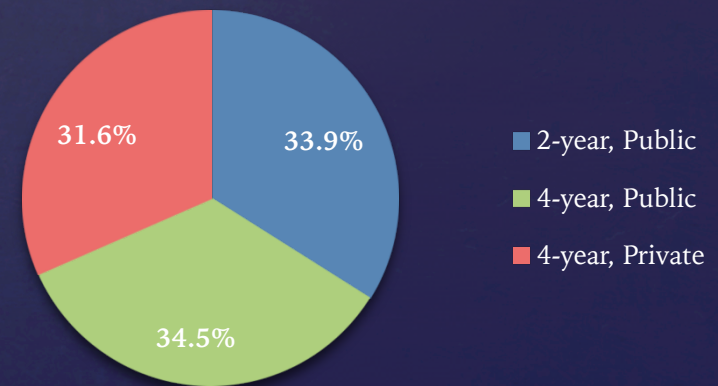

Enrollment in CT's colleges made up 20.2% of the regions' total higher education enrollment in Fall 2015

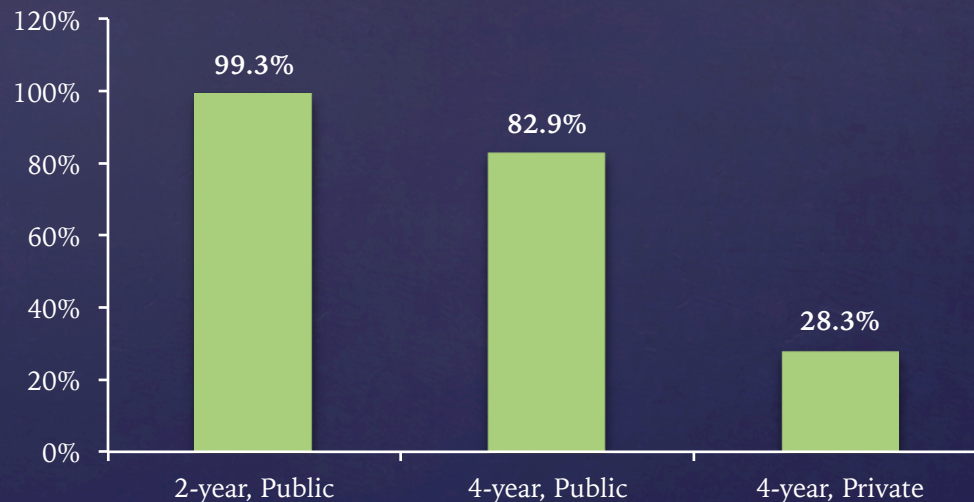
Share of Enrollment by Sector, Fall 2015



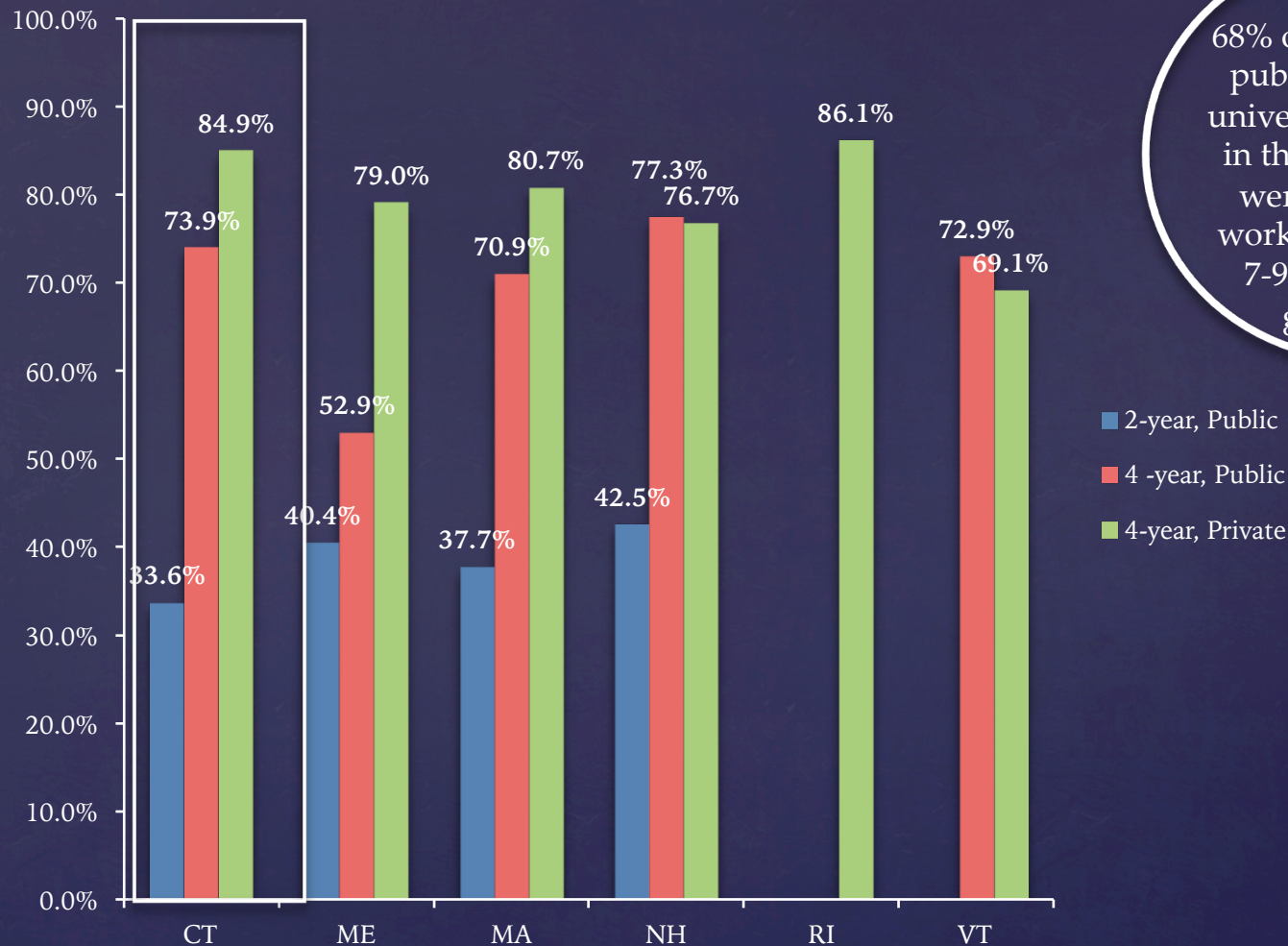

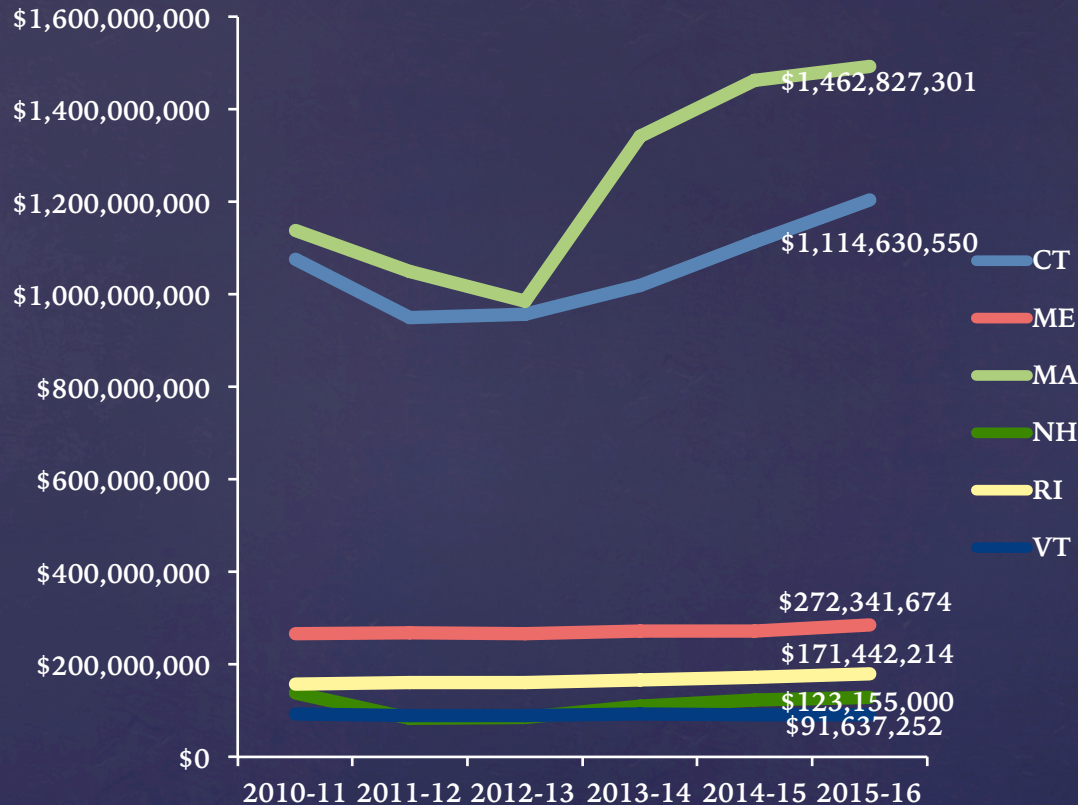
Average Net Price for a Student Receiving Aid



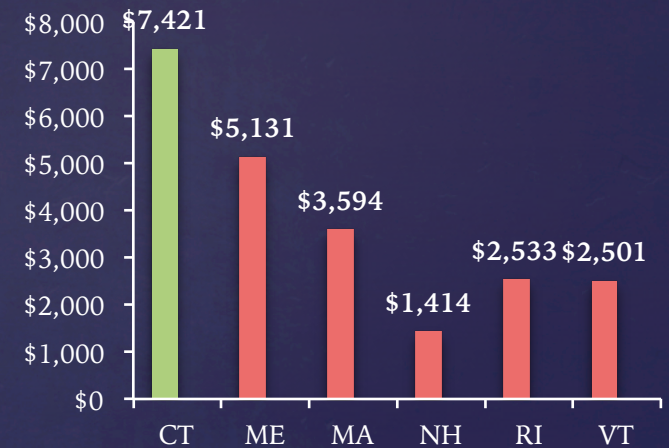
60% of the class of 2016 (4-year public and private college students) have student loan debt – on average \$35,494

State Support for Higher Education



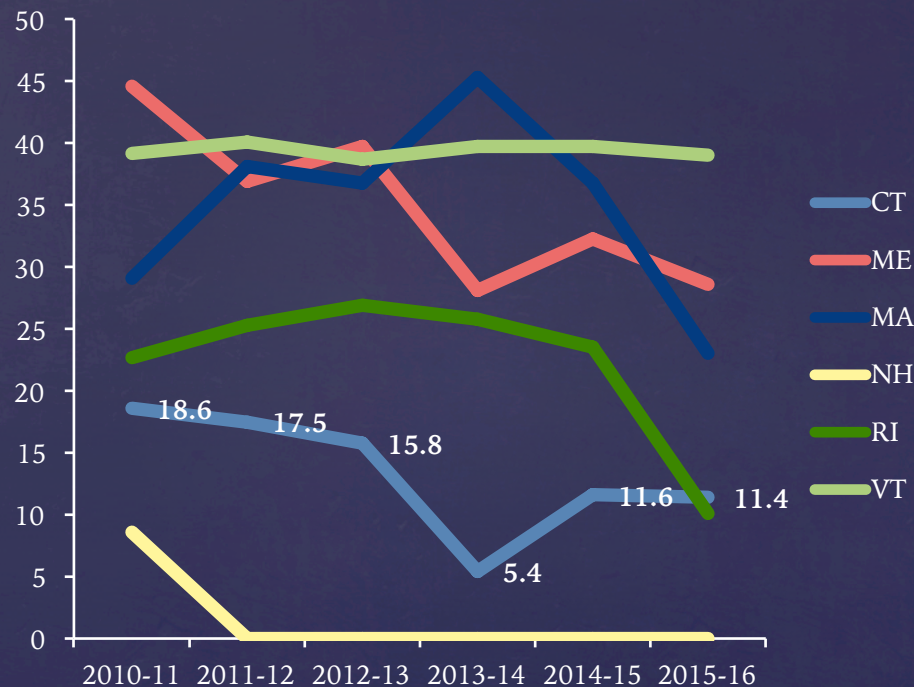
State Support per FTE, 2015-16

Number of Undergraduate Awards per 100 FTE



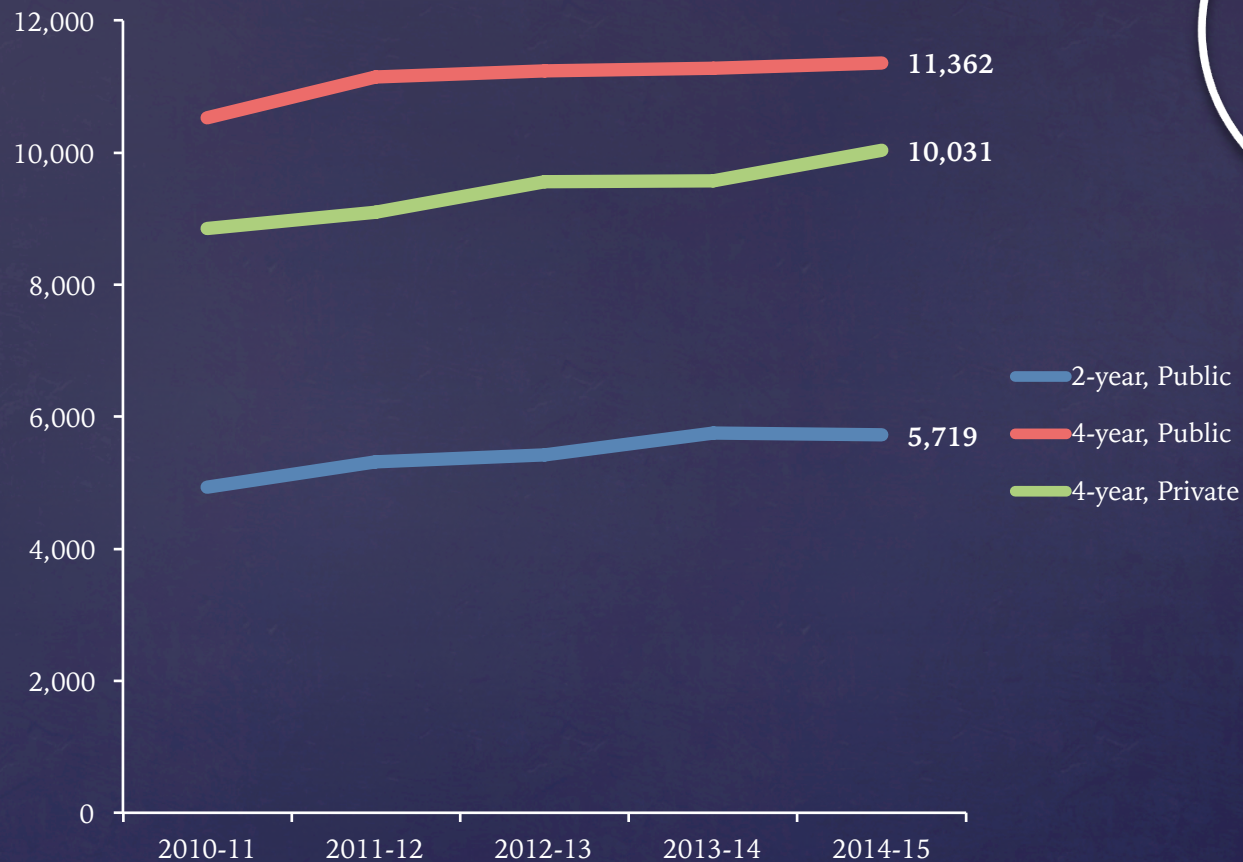
Undergraduate State Grant Dollars per FTE

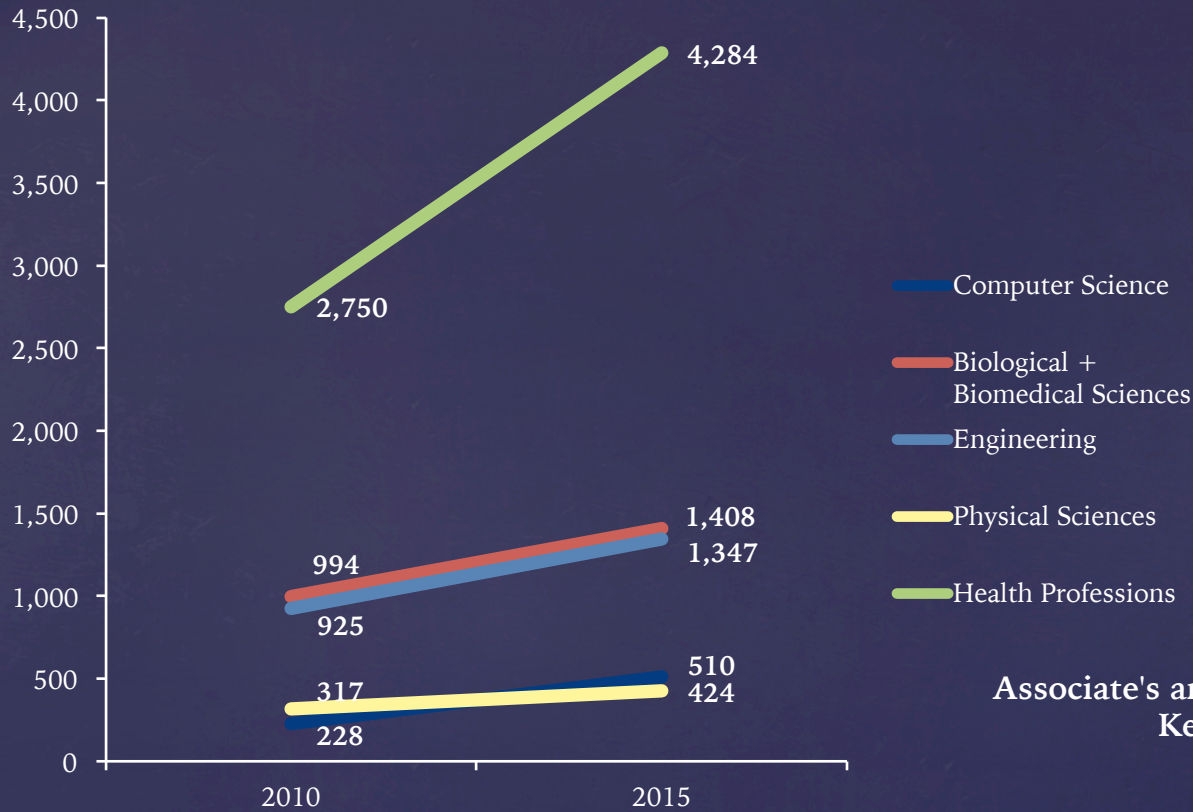
Number of Bachelor and Associate's Degrees Conferred



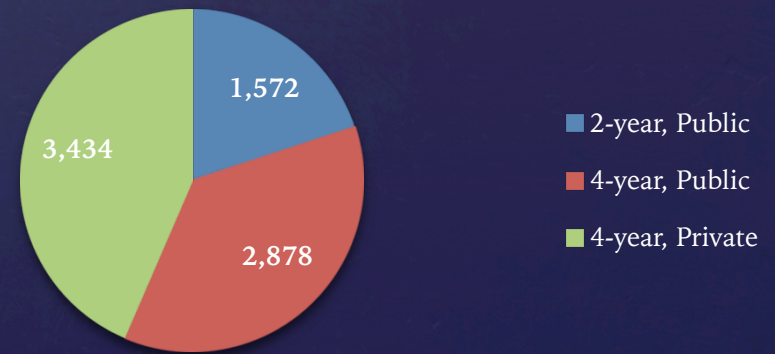
Connecticut has set the goal of 70% postsecondary attainment by 2025 – currently, 54% of the population has a credential, certificate or degree
