### PerformancePLUS (P+)

PerformancePLUS is a product suite comprised of Performance Tracker, Assessment Builder, and Curriculum Connector. These three modules interact to assist districts in managing and organizing vital and timely student data, creating local assessments and mapping curriculum. The Department of Education is currently providing regional and school based training to support use of the PerformancePLUS tools.

### Longitudinal Reports

There are two sets of Longitudinal Reports. The **Original Reports** (first five reports) display NECAP tested students only, with no restriction on attendance at the teaching school.

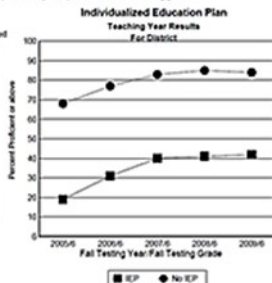
The **New Reports** (last four reports) are interactive and contain both NECAP and Alternately Assessed students who were in attendance at the teaching school/district more than 90% of the teaching year (the old AYP requirements and the new AMO requirements).

#### Fall Testing Grade: 6

This site was developed in response to the federal No Child Left Behind legislation and to New Hampshire State Law RSA 193-E:3 as a way to provide information about NH schools and communities. By clicking on your county and then selecting your town, you will be able to drill down into specific and helpful information about your school district including trends related to students, staff, testing results, accountability, and finances.



### Early Warning System

The NH DOE has developed a statewide Early Warning System (EWS) which has been rolled out to all NH public high schools and grades 4-8. The EWS assists school personnel in quickly identifying those students who are at risk of not being on track to graduate and ultimately dropping out of school. Access to the report is through myNHDOE. Contact your i4see coordinator for user access.

## HOW CAN THIS DATA HELP YOU?

- Understand the growth of students school-wide, class-wide, or within a subgroup.
- Use information from **PerformancePLUS** to target instruction or identify instructional gaps.
- Create your own local assessment and have students take the assessment on-line
- Create and administer a **Culture and Climate** survey.
- Engage parents and students.
- Capture student work and assessments.
- Track competency attainment.
- Identify trends in student demographic data.
- Facilitate **Data Team** conversations focused on student data.
- Validate or negate hypothesis related to the curriculum, instruction, demographics, or culture of your district and school.

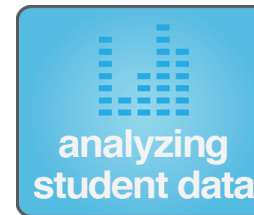
#### Analyzing Student Data Network
