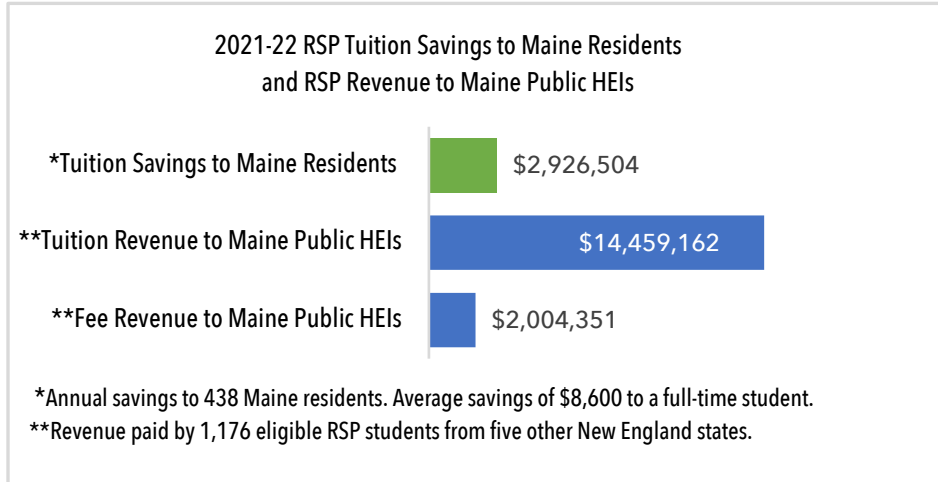


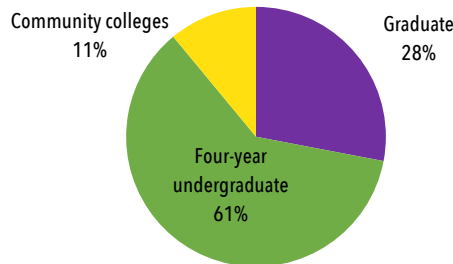
## Highlights of Maine's Participation in the Regional Student Program (RSP): 2021-22

The RSP provides savings on out-of-state tuition to Maine residents enrolled in approved degree programs at public campuses in the five other New England states and provides a reciprocal benefit to eligible New England residents enrolled at Maine's public higher education institutions (HEIs). Maine residents are eligible for more than 1,200 undergraduate and graduate degree programs through the RSP, also known as Tuition Break.
