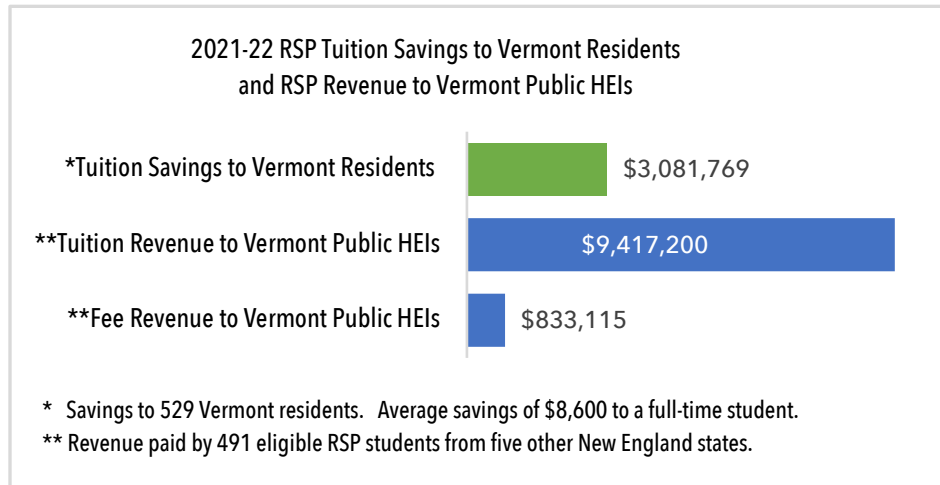


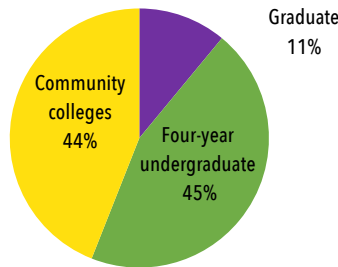
## Highlights of Vermont's Participation in the Regional Student Program (RSP): 2021-22

The RSP provides savings on out-of-state tuition to Vermont residents enrolled in approved degree programs at public campuses in the five other New England states and provides a reciprocal benefit to eligible New England residents enrolled at Vermont's public higher education institutions (HEIs). Vermont residents are eligible for more than 1,500 undergraduate and graduate degree programs through the RSP, also known as Tuition Break.
