Executive Summary

As the New England states, towns, colleges, schools, businesses and citizens wrestle collectively and individually with the grim news about the collapsing world financial markets, the New England Board of Higher Education reports some good news: the 51-year-old Regional Student Program (RSP) saved New England residents about \$48 million this year alone. That's an average amount of \$7,000 that a participating college student did not have to spend on his or her 2008-09 tuition bill.

Because of the RSP, New England residents are eligible for a tuition break when they enroll at out-of-state public colleges and universities in the six-state region and pursue approved degree programs not offered by their home-state public institutions. In some cases, eligibility also extends to students whose home is closer to an out-of-state college than to an in-state college.

More than 8,000 New England residents benefited from the RSP this academic year. The region's public colleges and universities received nearly \$47 million in 2008-09 tuition revenue from students enrolled through the RSP. The RSP helps participating campuses attract and retain New England students who might have attended college outside the region if the tuition break were not available.

Over the past 51 years, the RSP has provided New England residents with discounts on nearly 225,000 annual college tuition bills, with total savings estimated to exceed \$1 billion in current dollars. The RSP has also helped the individual New England states and their public higher education institutions avoid billions of dollars in capital and operating expenditures by eliminating the need to duplicate academic programs that are offered through the RSP by public colleges and universities in other New England states.

NEBHE established the RSP in 1957-58 to fulfill the purposes of the congressionally authorized New England Higher Education Compact – expanding educational opportunities for New England residents and sharing higher education resources.


The RSP provides New Englanders more affordable access to nearly 700 out-of-state degree programs. Many RSP programs are in specialized and high-demand fields of study, such as Pharmacy, Dental Medicine, Biomedical Engineering, Aquaculture, Design, Communications and Media, Criminal Justice and Law, Meteorology, Health Care Management, Chinese, Japanese and Physiology and Neurobiology.

Nineteen new RSP programs were approved in 2008, including bachelor's degree majors in Cognitive Science, Public Health Sciences, Sustainability Studies, and Sustainable Product Design and Innovation.

On a personal level, many RSP alumni and students have spoken about how the RSP allowed them to afford and earn their chosen degree in New England, without incurring excessive debt and facilitated their remaining in New England for their career. This report provides data on RSP enrollment and tuition revenue and savings for the 2008-09 academic year, as well as historical data. NEBHE thanks the campus officials, who provided detailed fall 2008 RSP enrollment information, as well as the RSP representatives and administrators responsible for overseeing the ongoing participation of their institutions in the RSP.

NEBHE extends appreciation to the state legislators and governors of the six New England states for their steadfast commitment to regional collaboration. In this difficult economic climate, when financing a college education is an even more pressing concern, the RSP provides much-needed tuition relief to New England students and families and fosters cost-efficient resource sharing among the six New England states.

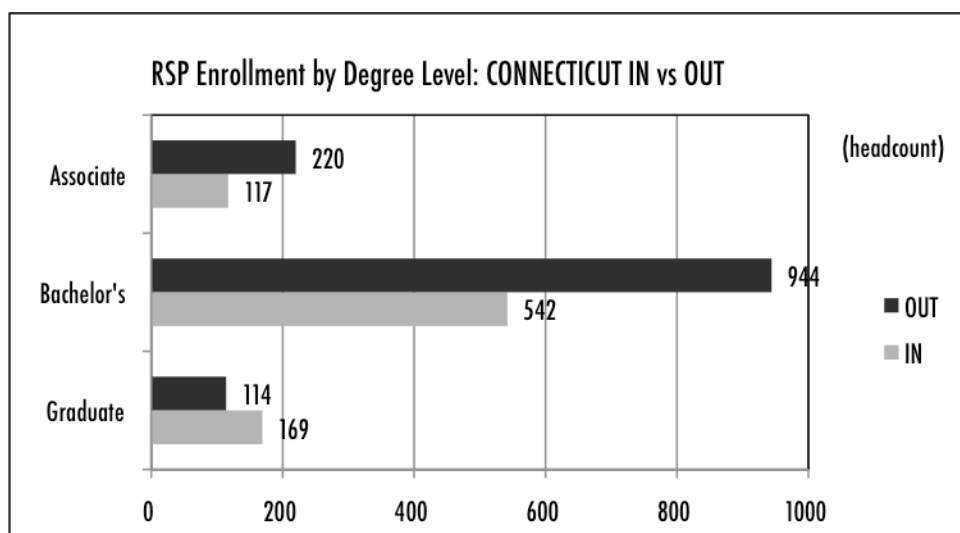

Summary of 2008-09 Regional Student Program (RSP) Data

2008-09 RSP Tuition Savings and Revenue

During the 2008-09 academic year, the RSP provided New England residents a total of nearly \$48 million in savings on their 2008-09 tuition bills. The average annual tuition break for a full-time RSP student was about \$7,000. Total RSP tuition savings increased 7 percent over last year. The RSP participating institutions received nearly \$47 million in tuition revenue from RSP students in 2008-09, up 11 percent over last year (See Figs. 1 and 2).

The majority of RSP institutions set their RSP tuition at 150 percent of their in-state rate. The maximum RSP tuition rate approved by NEBHE is 175 percent of the in-state rate (effective Fall 2006). The following institutions charge the 175 percent rate: Keene State College, Massachusetts College of Art and Design, Massachusetts Maritime Academy, Plymouth State University, University of Connecticut, University of Connecticut Dental School, University of Connecticut Law School, University of Connecticut Medical School, University of Massachusetts Amherst, University of Massachusetts Worcester School of Nursing, University of New Hampshire (Undergraduate), University of New Hampshire at Manchester, University of Rhode Island (Undergraduate), University of Vermont.

2008-09 RSP Enrollment Data

Total RSP enrollment this academic year was a headcount of 8,202, reflecting a 3 percent increase over last year. Total FTE enrollment increased by 7 percent. Undergraduate enrollment at the four-year state colleges and universities increased by 14 percent. Overall community college enrollment decreased by 7 percent from last year (CCRI reported a 53 percent decrease as a result of institutional policy changes).

The majority of RSP students were undergraduate students: 50 percent were enrolled at four-year public colleges and universities, and 41 percent were enrolled at community and technical colleges. Nine percent of RSP students were graduate students.

History of RSP Participation

Since the first year of RSP enrollment in 1957, the RSP has provided New England students discounts on nearly 225,000 annual tuition bills (See Fig. 11). The RSP has afforded participating students a total of more than \$1 billion in tuition savings, when calculated in current dollars.

Data Source

The New England Board of Higher Education surveyed all of the RSP participating institutions for Fall 2008 enrollment data and student characteristics. NEBHE calculated annual 2008-09 enrollment and tuition savings and revenue data, based on fall 2008 enrollment data and annual tuition rates.

The average tuition break for a full-time RSP student was about \$7,000. The RSP participating institutions received more than \$46.5 million in tuition revenue from RSP students.

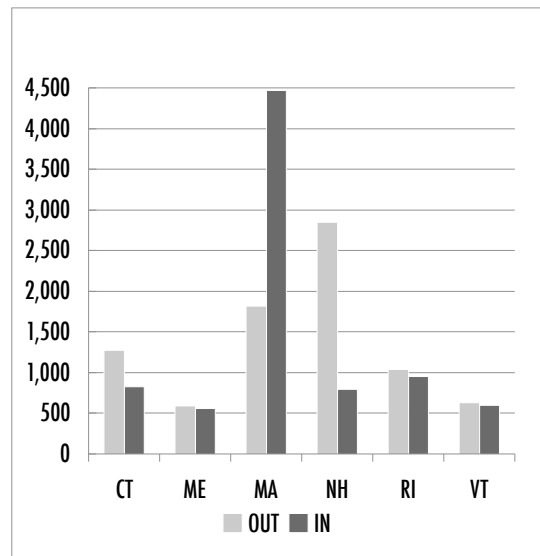

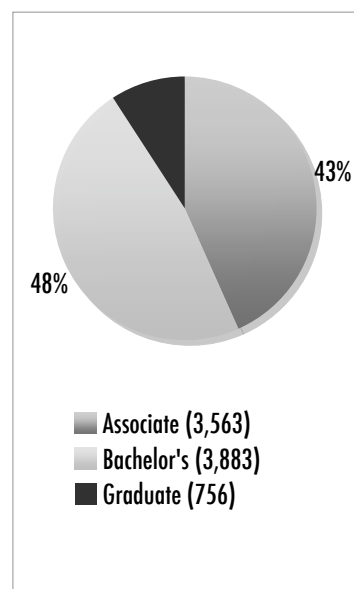


Fig. 10. A Decade of RSP Enrollment by Institution and State: 1999-2000 through 2008-09

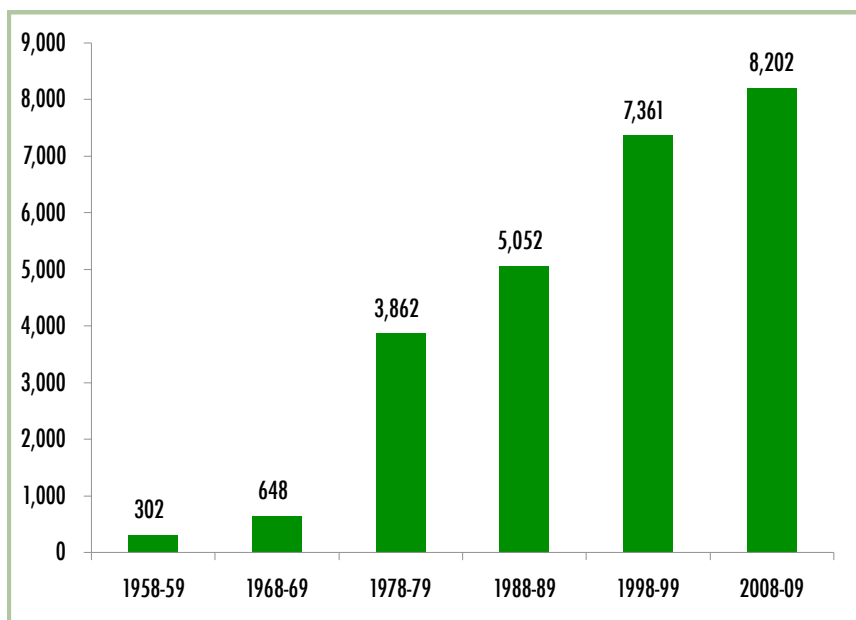
