New England Board of Higher Education's Regional Student Program (RSP) Tuition Break

2011-12 Annual Report Executive Summary

Academic year 2011-12 marks the 55th year of the New England Board of Higher Education's Regional Student Program (RSP), Tuition Break, and the third consecutive year of record-high enrollments in the program.

A total of 9,293 New England residents were enrolled this year under the RSP and saved an estimated \$53 million on their 2011-12 tuition bills. Students enrolled full time saved an average of \$6,900.

Because of NEBHE and its RSP, New England residents are eligible for a tuition discount when they enroll at out-of-state public colleges and universities in the six-state region and pursue approved degree programs not offered by their home-state public institutions. In some cases, eligibility also extends to students whose home is closer to an out-of-state college than to an in-state college.

NEBHE established the RSP in 1957-58 to fulfill the purposes of the congressionally authorized New England Higher Education Compact – expanding educational opportunities for New England residents and sharing higher education resources.

Since it was established, the RSP has provided New England residents with discounts on 252,000 annual college tuition bills, with the total savings estimated to be well over \$1.2 billion in current dollars.

The region's public colleges and universities received nearly \$62 million in tuition revenue from the RSP students enrolled in 2011-12. The RSP helps participating campuses attract and retain out-of-state New England students who might have attended college elsewhere if the RSP tuition discount were not available.

New England's bachelor's-degree-granting colleges and universities saw their RSP enrollments increase by 4 percent over last year. The top 10 most popular RSP bachelor's degree programs in 2011-12 were biomedical engineering, pharmacy, hospitality and tourism management, visual arts, criminology and criminal justice, recreation management, zoology, communications/media, marine sciences and legal studies.

In all, more than 700 undergraduate and graduate degree programs are made available under the RSP by New England's 80 public colleges and universities, many of them in specialized and high-demand fields of study.

The region's community colleges, for example, offer an array of STEM programs through the RSP, such as automotive technology, biotechnology, energy technology, fiber optics, fire science, game programming and medical technology, as well as transfer opportunities for bachelor's degree-seeking students. Also, many of the community colleges offer the RSP tuition discount to students in neighboring states, when the nearest home-state community college is farther from home.


The participating institutions propose and approve new degree programs for RSP eligibility every year, including the following 23 new programs in 2011:

- Bachelor's degree programs: bioengineering, community studies, ethics, social and political philosophy, fire and emergency services management, gerontology, labor studies, neuroscience and behavior, philosophy and public policy, psychology and community studies, sustainable agriculture and food systems.
- Associate degree programs: bioinformatics, community health, composite technology, emergency management, lab animal care, marine biotechnology, railroad engineering technology, web technologies
- Graduate programs: business analytics and project management (MS), development policy and practice (MS), environmental conservation (MS, PhD) and sustainability science (MS).

The RSP eliminates the need to duplicate academic programs offered by public colleges and universities in other New England states and therefore helps the individual New England states and their public higher education institutions avoid countless billions of dollars in capital and operating expenditures.

This report provides data on RSP enrollment and tuition revenue and savings for the 2011-12 academic year, as well as historical data. NEBHE thanks the campus officials who provided detailed fall 2011 RSP enrollment information, as well as the RSP representatives and administrators who oversee the ongoing participation of their institutions in the RSP.

NEBHE extends appreciation to the state legislators and governors of the six New England states for their steadfast commitment to regional collaboration. In this difficult economic climate, when financing a college education is an even more pressing concern, NEBHE's Tuition Break program provides much-needed tuition relief to New England students and families and fosters cost-efficient resource-sharing among the six New England states.

Summary of 2011-12 Regional Student Program (RSP) Data

2011-12 RSP Tuition Savings and Revenue

The New England Board of Higher Education's Regional Student Program (RSP) Tuition Break provided New England residents an estimated total of \$53 million in savings on their 2011-12 tuition bills. The average savings for a full-time RSP student was \$6,900. The RSP participating institutions received nearly \$62 million in tuition revenue from RSP students in 2011-12.

2011-12 RSP Enrollment Data

Total RSP enrollment this academic year was a headcount of 9,293, up 1% over last year. Enrollment at bachelor's degree-granting institutions accounted for 51% of total enrollment, and increased by 4% over last year. Community college enrollment – 40% of total enrollment – decreased by 2% over last year. Meanwhile, overall graduate enrollment saw no change.

Connecticut, Maine and Massachusetts saw the highest percentage of their state's residents enrolled under the RSP at bachelor's degree-granting institutions – 79%, 58% and 58%, respectively.

Meanwhile, New Hampshire, Vermont and Rhode Island saw the highest percentage of their state's residents enrolled under the RSP at community colleges – 58%, 49% and 48%, respectively.

Enrollment breakdowns by type of institution and state are provided in Figs. 1 through 9. Migration data by degree level for each state is included on the states' individual highlights pages (pages 5-10). Enrollment numbers for individual degree programs are provided in the Appendix.

History of RSP Participation

Since the first year of RSP enrollment in 1957, the RSP has provided New England students with discounts on nearly 252,000 annual tuition bills (See Fig. 11). The RSP has afforded participating students a total of more than \$1.2 billion in tuition savings, when calculated in current dollars.

Data Source

The New England Board of Higher Education surveyed all of the RSP participating institutions for Fall 2011 enrollment data and student characteristics. NEBHE calculated annual 2011-12 enrollment and tuition savings and revenue data, based on fall 2011 enrollment data and annual tuition rates.

NEBHE's Regional Student Program (RSP) provided New England residents an estimated total of \$53 million in savings on their 2011-12 tuition bills. The average annual tuition discount for a full-time RSP student was \$6,900. The RSP participating institutions received an estimated total of \$61.8 million in tuition revenue from RSP students.

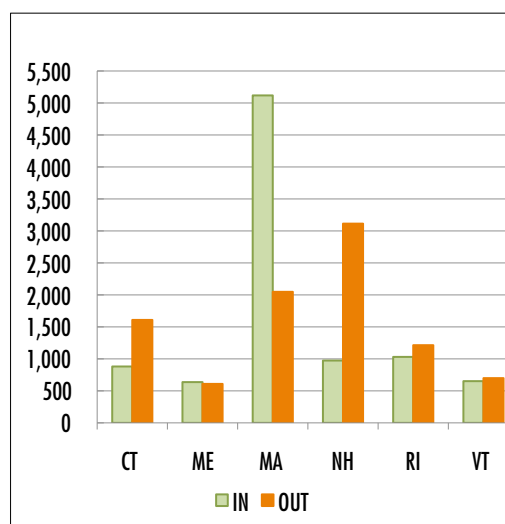

Fig 8. RSP Migration by State: 2011-12

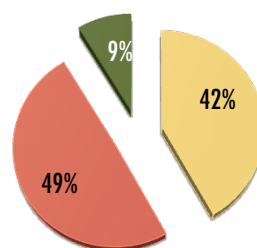

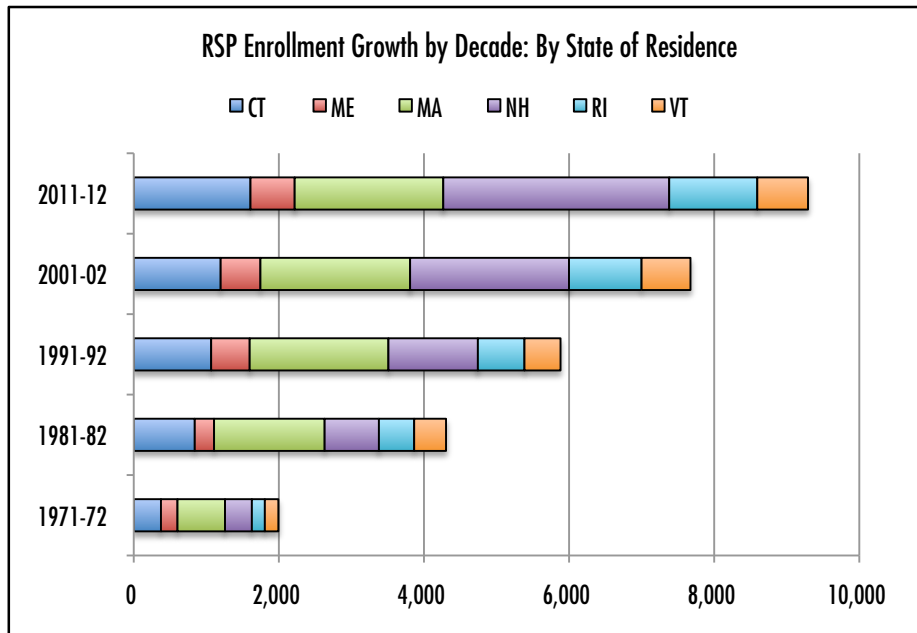
