New England Board of Higher Education's Tuition Break for New England Residents

New England Regional Student Program

2012-13 Annual Report Executive Summary

This academic year, a total of 9,338 New England residents were enrolled under the New England Board of Higher Education's Regional Student Program (RSP) and saved an estimated \$53 million on their 2012-13 tuition bills. Students who were enrolled full time saved an average of \$6,955.

Because of NEBHE and its RSP, New England residents are eligible for a tuition discount when they enroll at out-of-state public colleges and universities in the six-state region and pursue approved degree programs not offered by their home-state public institutions. At some colleges, eligibility also extends to students whose home is closer to an out-of-state college than to an in-state college.

Academic year 2012-13 marks the 56th year of the RSP, which NEBHE established in 1957-58 to fulfill the purposes of the congressionally authorized New England Higher Education Compact – expanding educational opportunities for New England residents and sharing higher education resources.

Since it was established, the RSP has provided New England residents with discounts on 261,000 annual college tuition bills, with the total savings estimated to be well over \$1.2 billion in current dollars.

NEBHE's Tuition Break program not only provides much-needed tuition relief to New England students and families but also fosters cost-efficient resource-sharing among the six New England states.

The RSP eliminates the need to duplicate academic programs offered by public colleges and universities in other New England states and therefore helps the individual New England states and their public higher education institutions avoid countless billions of dollars in capital and operating expenditures.

The region's public colleges and universities received more than \$64 million in tuition revenue from the RSP students enrolled at their campuses in 2012-13. The RSP helps participating campuses attract and retain out-of-state New England students who would have likely attended college elsewhere if the RSP tuition discount were not available.

Expansion of RSP Program Offerings


More than 750 undergraduate and graduate degree programs have been approved for eligibility under the RSP through an annual peer-review conducted by NEBHE, which engages all the RSP participating institutions. A significant number of RSP degree programs are in specialized or high-demand career areas, such as biomedical engineering, environmental engineering, allied health, pharmacy, energy services technology, advanced manufacturing technology, sustainability studies and tourism.

The RSP degree programs have historically been restricted to majors only; however, the RSP policies were revised in March 2012 to also allow for the approval of specialized concentrations that are comparable to majors in their content.

The 2012 Annual Review resulted in the approval of 24 additional degree programs:

- **Associate degree program (1):** Polysomnographic Technology.
- **Bachelor's degree programs (8):** Allied Health; Design (Graphic & Web BFA); Energy Systems Engineering; Environmental, Earth and Ocean Sciences; Human Development and Family Studies; Nuclear Medicine Technology; Peace and Conflict Studies; and Visual Communications.
- **Graduate programs (15):** Adult Learning (MA); Autism Studies (MS); Bioengineering (PhD); Cognitive Science (Cert.); Conflict Resolution (Cert.); Criminal Justice (PhD); Direct-Entry Nursing (MS); Engineering and Applied Science (PhD); Food Systems (MS); Global Governance and Human Security (PhD); Health Care Genetics (Professional Science Master's); International Relations (MSPA); Museum Studies (MA); Peace and Conflict Studies (MA); and Urban Multicultural Special Education (MEd).

This report provides data on RSP enrollment and tuition revenue and savings for the 2012-13 academic year, as well as historical data. NEBHE thanks the campus officials who provided detailed fall 2012 RSP enrollment information, as well as the RSP representatives and administrators who oversee the ongoing participation of their institutions in the RSP.

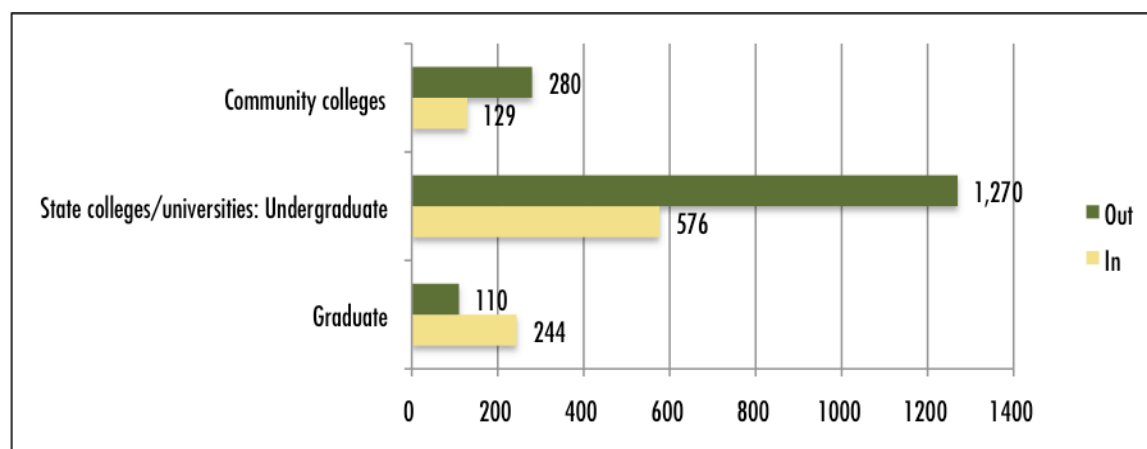

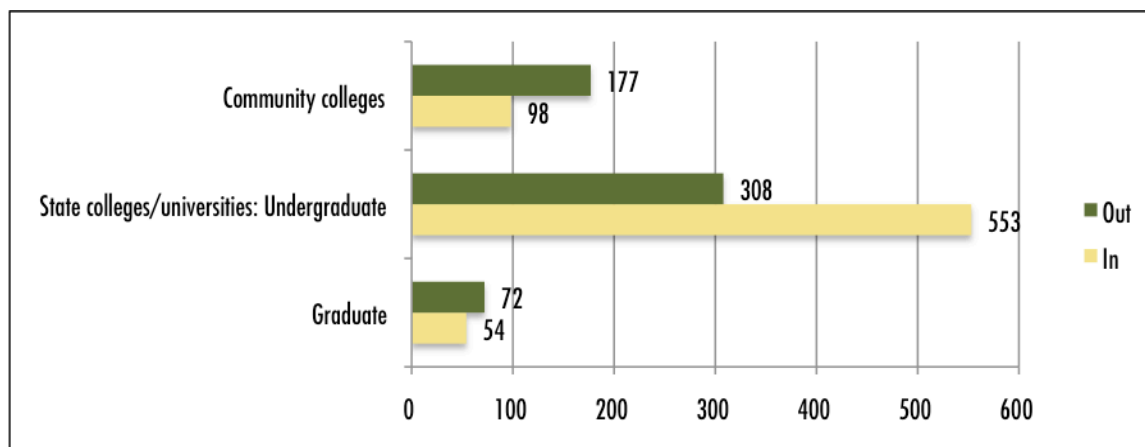

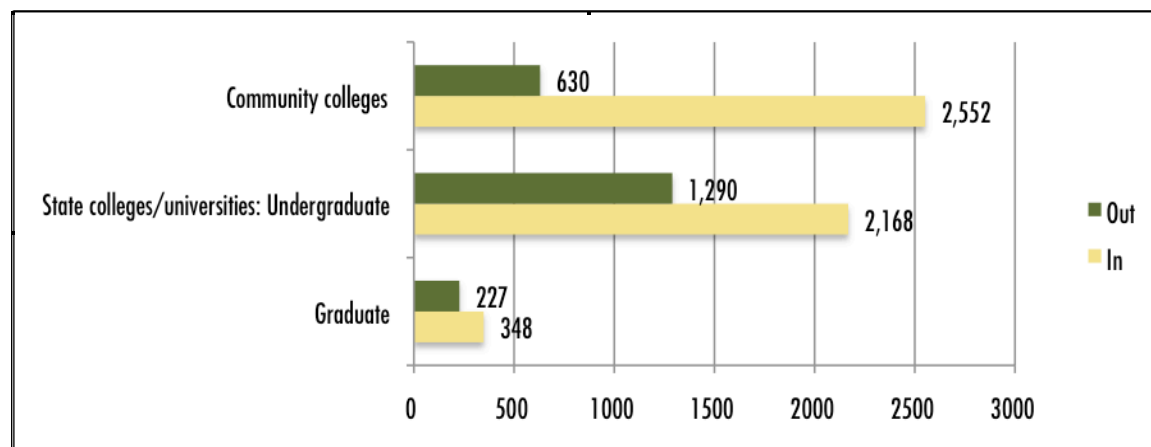

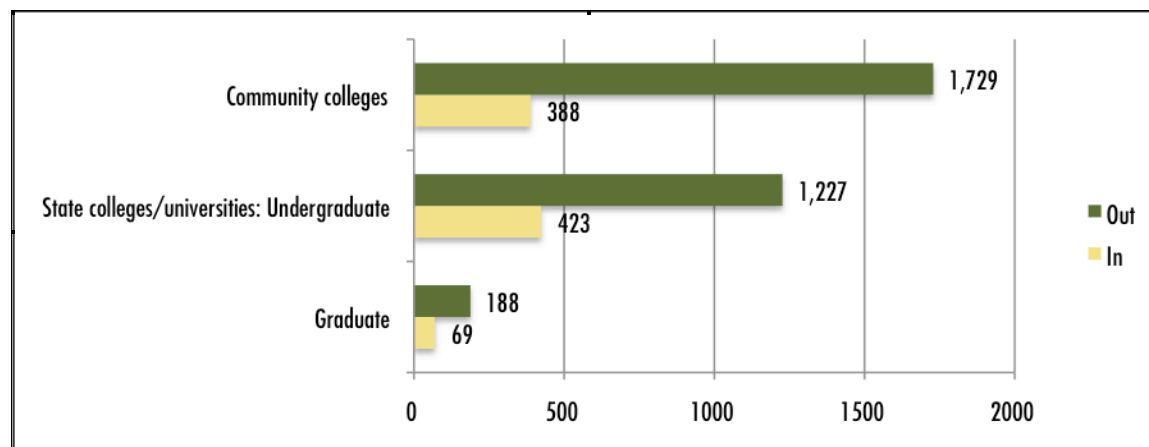

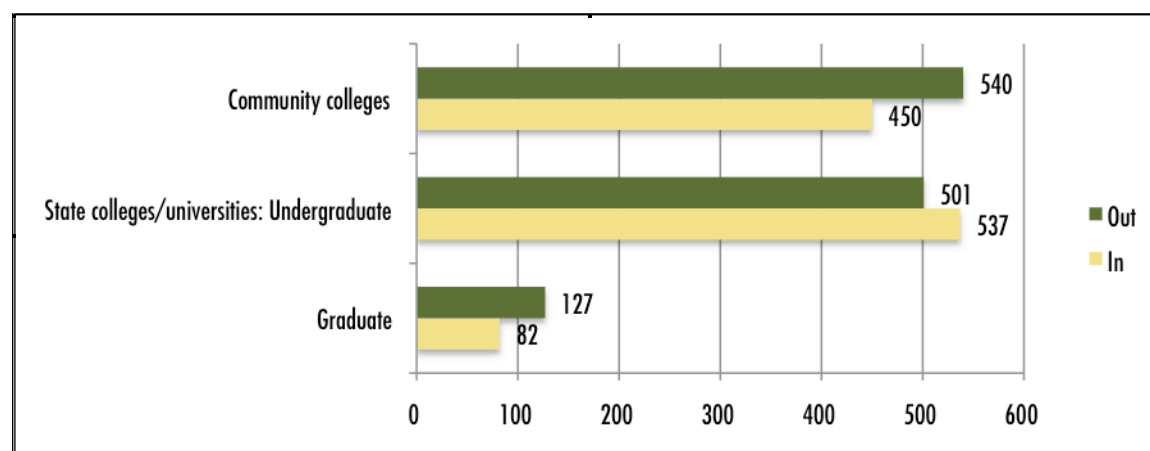

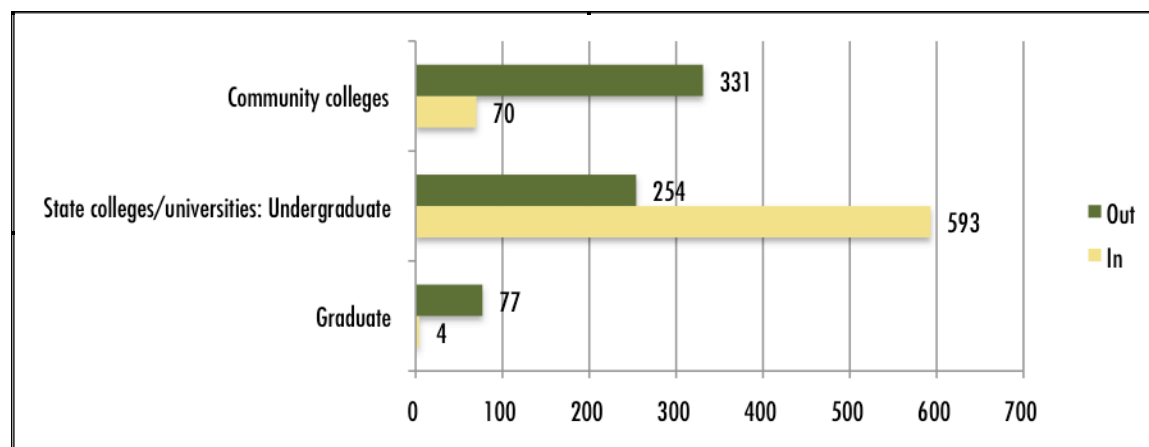

Summary of 2012-13 Regional Student Program (RSP) Data

2012-13 RSP Tuition Savings and Revenue

The New England Board of Higher Education's Regional Student Program (RSP) Tuition Break provided New England residents an estimated total of \$53 million in savings on their 2012-13 tuition bills. The average savings for a full-time RSP student was \$6,955. Meanwhile, the RSP participating institutions received more than \$64 million in tuition revenue from RSP students in 2012-13.

2012-13 RSP Enrollment Data

Total RSP enrollment this academic year was a headcount of 9,338, up just under 1% from last year. Enrollment at bachelor's degree-granting institutions accounted for 50% of total enrollment. Community colleges accounted for 39% of enrollment, undergraduate enrollment at the state colleges and universities, 52% and graduate enrollment, 9%.

Incoming enrollment

States with increases in the number of RSP students attending their public colleges and universities in 2012-13 were Maine (11%), Connecticut (8%), Rhode Island (4%) and Vermont (2%). States with decreases were New Hampshire (-10%) and Massachusetts (-1%).

Outgoing enrollment

States with increases in the number of their residents participating in the RSP in 2012-13 were Massachusetts (5%), Connecticut (3%) and New Hampshire (1%). States with decreases were Maine (-9%), Vermont (-5%) and Rhode Island (-4%).

Connecticut, Massachusetts and Maine saw the highest percentage of their state's residents enrolled under the RSP at bachelor's degree-granting institutions – 77%, 60% and 55% respectively.

Meanwhile, New Hampshire, Vermont and Rhode Island saw the highest percentage of their state's residents enrolled under the RSP at community colleges – 55%, 50% and 46%, respectively.

Enrollment breakdowns by type of institution and state are provided in Figs. 1 through 9. Migration data by degree level for each state is included on the states' individual highlights pages (pages 5-10). Enrollment numbers for individual degree programs are provided in the Appendix.

History of RSP Participation

Since the first year of RSP enrollment in 1957, the RSP has provided New England students with discounts on more than 261,000 annual tuition bills (See Fig. 11). The RSP has afforded participating students a total of more than \$1.2 billion in tuition savings, when calculated in current dollars.

Data Source

The New England Board of Higher Education surveyed all of the RSP participating institutions for fall 2012 enrollment data and student characteristics. NEBHE calculated annual 2012-13 enrollment and tuition savings and revenue data, based on fall 2012 enrollment data and annual tuition rates.

Fig. 1. RSP Tuition Savings and Revenue and Enrollment by State: 2012-13

NEBHE's Regional Student Program (RSP) provided New England residents an estimated total of \$53 million in savings on their 2012-13 tuition bills. The average annual tuition discount for a full-time RSP student was almost \$7,000. The RSP participating institutions received an estimated total of \$64 million in tuition revenue from RSP students.

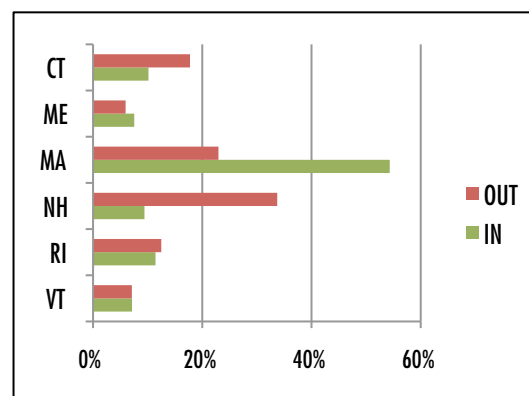
Fig. 6. Undergraduate RSP Enrollment at State Colleges and Universities: 2012-13

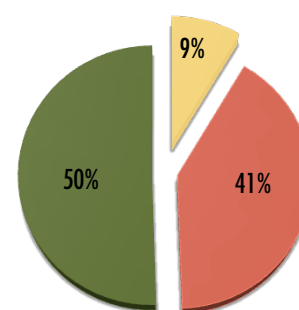
Fig 8. RSP Migration by State: 2012-13

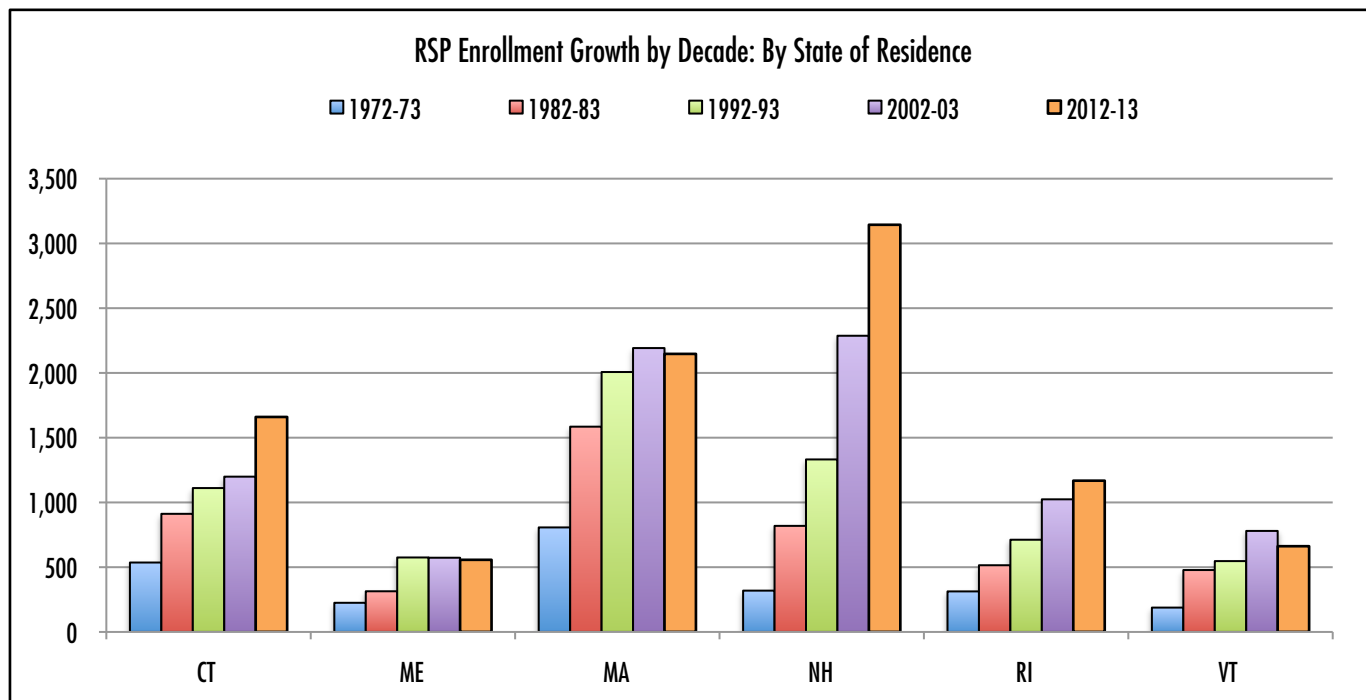
