New England Board of Higher Education's Tuition Break for New England Residents
New England Regional Student Program
2017-18 Annual Report Executive Summary

This academic year, a total of 8,654 New England residents were enrolled under the New England Board of Higher Education's Regional Student Program (RSP) and saved an estimated \$59 million on their 2017-18 tuition bills. A full-time student saved an average of \$8,157.

Because of NEBHE and its RSP, New England residents are eligible for a tuition discount when they enroll at out-of-state public colleges and universities in the six-state region and pursue approved degree programs not offered by their home-state public institutions. At some colleges, eligibility also extends to students whose home is closer to an out-of-state college than to an in-state college.

Academic year 2017-18 marks the 60th year of enrollment in the RSP, which NEBHE established in 1957-58 to fulfill the purposes of the congressionally authorized New England Higher Education Compact – expanding educational opportunities for New England residents and sharing higher education resources. Since it was established, the RSP has provided New England residents with discounts on nearly 307,000 annual college tuition bills.

NEBHE's Tuition Break program not only provides much-needed tuition relief to New England students and families but also fosters cost-efficient resource sharing among the six New England states.

The RSP eliminates the need to duplicate academic programs offered by public colleges and universities in other New England states and therefore helps the individual New England states and their public higher education institutions avoid billions of dollars in capital and operating expenditures.

The region's public colleges and universities received an estimated \$97 million in tuition revenue – and approximately \$23 million in fee revenue – from the RSP students enrolled at their campuses in 2017-18. The RSP helps participating campuses in a competitive admissions environment to attract and retain out-of-state New England students, who would have likely attended college elsewhere if the RSP tuition discount were not available.


Expansion of RSP Program Offerings

More than 850 undergraduate and graduate degree programs are approved for eligibility under the RSP through an annual peer-review conducted by NEBHE, which engages all the RSP participating institutions. A significant number of RSP degree programs are in specialized or high-demand career areas, such as biomedical engineering, environmental engineering, allied health, pharmacy, energy services technology, advanced manufacturing technology and sustainability studies.

The 2017 Annual Review resulted in the approval of 33 additional degree programs:

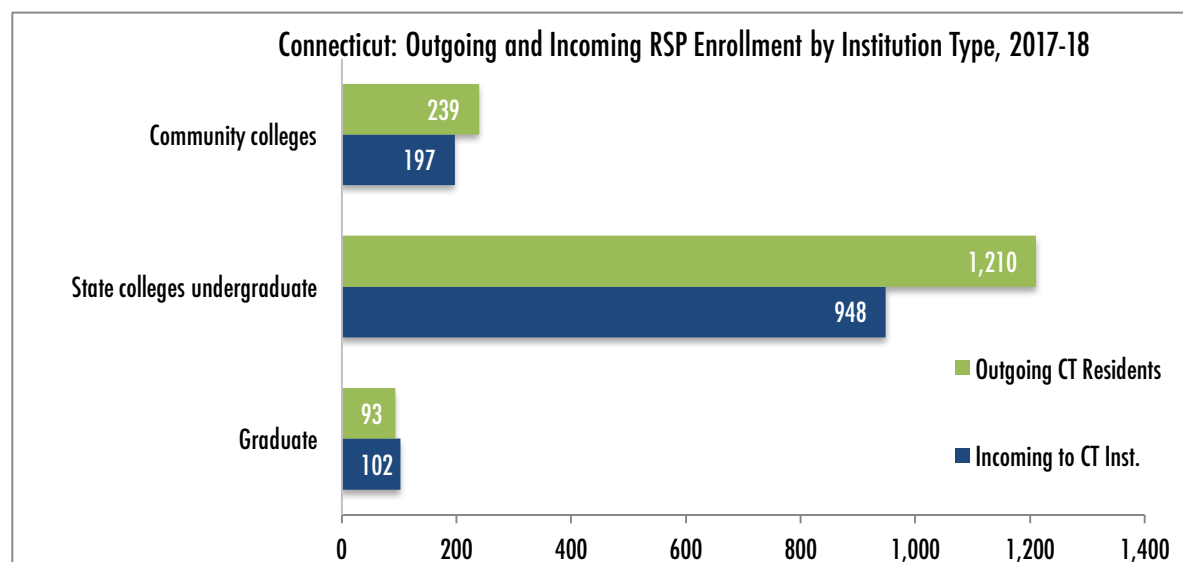

Summary of 2017-18 Regional Student Program (RSP) Data

2017-18 RSP Tuition Savings and Revenue

The 2017-18 academic year marks the 60th year of enrollment in the New England Board of Higher Education's Regional Student Program (RSP). The RSP has provided New England students and families significant savings on nearly 307,000 annual tuition bills since 1957, with estimated total tuition savings in the billions of dollars.

The RSP provided New England residents an estimated total of \$59 million in savings on their 2017-18 tuition bills. The weighted-average savings per full-time student was \$8,157.

Meanwhile, the RSP participating institutions received an estimated total of almost \$97 million in tuition revenue from RSP students in 2017-18.

2017-18 RSP Enrollment

A total of 8,654 students were enrolled through the RSP in Fall 2017. By institution type, 59% were enrolled in four-year undergraduate programs, 35% in community college programs, and 6% in graduate programs.

Highlights of Changes in Enrollment: Fall 2017 vs Fall 2016

Total RSP enrollment ...

- decreased by 3.9%, following a 0.5% increase in Fall 2016
- increased at the institutions in only one state, Vermont

Four-year undergraduate enrollment ...

- decreased overall by 2 percent, following a 6.8% increase in Fall 2016
- increased at institutions in three states: New Hampshire, 8%; Vermont, 4% and Rhode Island, 3%
- increased among residents of one state only: Maine, 6%

Community college enrollment ...

- overall decreased nearly 9%, following a 5.4% decrease in Fall 2016
- increased in three states: Connecticut, 17%; Vermont, 9% and Maine, 7%

Graduate enrollment ...

- increased overall by 11%, following a 17.6% decrease in Fall 2016
- increased at institutions in four states: Massachusetts, 57%; Maine, 11%, Vermont, 9% and New Hampshire, 7%
- increased among residents of four states: Vermont, 72% (to 50 students); New Hampshire, 43% (to 172 students); Maine, 19% (to 43 students); and Rhode Island, 5% (to 70 students)

Snapshot of Overall Enrollment Trends

Five of the New England states saw one-year decreases in overall enrollment (public and independent), according to the National Student Clearinghouse data. Massachusetts saw no change from Fall 2016.

Data Source

The New England Board of Higher Education surveyed all of the RSP participating institutions for Fall 2017 enrollment data and student characteristics. NEBHE calculated annual 2017-18 enrollment and tuition savings and revenue data, based on Fall 2017 enrollment data and annual tuition rates.

NEBHE's Regional Student Program (RSP) provided New England residents an estimated total of \$59 million in savings on their 2017-18 tuition bills. The average annual tuition discount for a full-time RSP student was \$8,157. The RSP participating institutions received an estimated total of \$96.8 million in tuition revenue from RSP students.

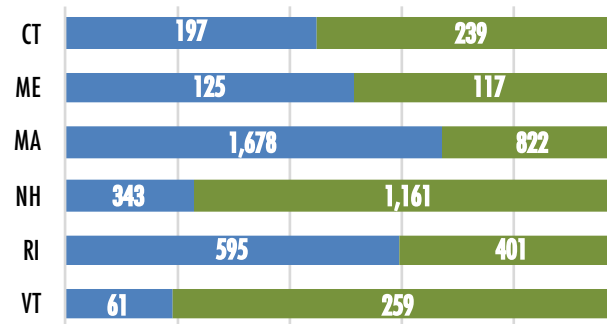

Fig 8. RSP Migration: 2017-18

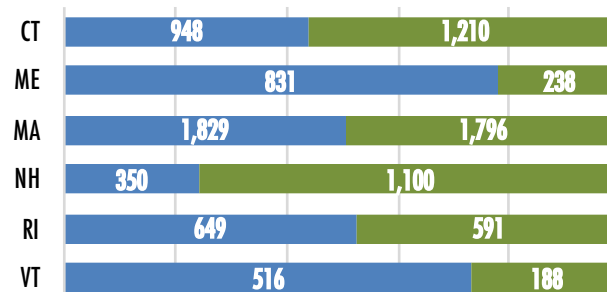

RSP Graduate Enrollment: 2017-18 ■ IN ■ OUT

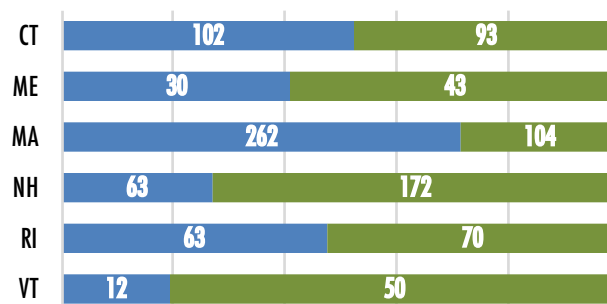


Fig. 9. RSP Enrollment by Institution and State: 2008-09 through 2017-18 (headcount)

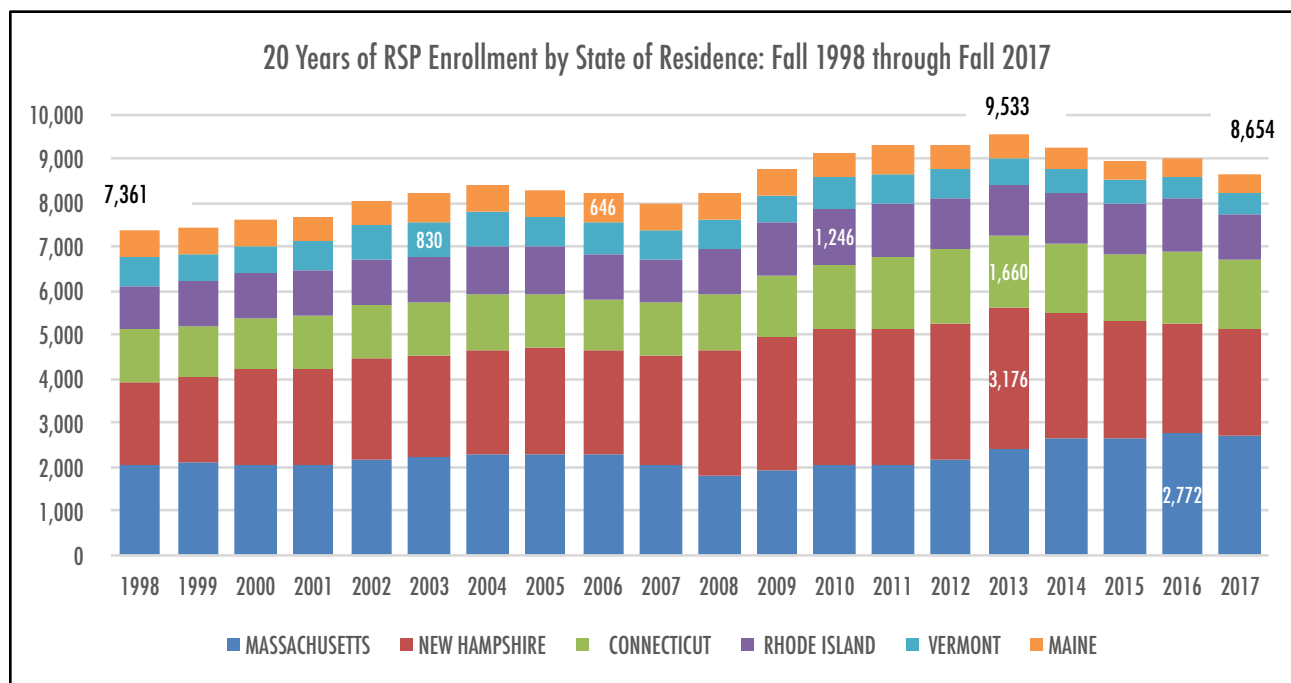
