Expectations were low.

- Tennessee economy is strong. – ~3% unemployment
- Assume 12,000 will apply; 8,000 will enroll. – This was met with skepticism.









All Projections Exceeded

42,000 applications 18,100 enrolled



Cohort 1

71% female 56% have children 34 is the average age 35% have never enrolled before 35% attended college previously 75% household income < \$50,000 86% plan to work while enrolled





Reconnect Student Success

 Average enrollment – 9+ credits colleges.

 75% Fall – Spring retention students enrolling right out of high school.

-Increase in number of adults enrolled in community

- Far exceeds non-Reconnect adults and non-Promise
