

New England Adult Learner Survey Findings

Higher Education Experience

NOVEMBER 2020

In the spring of 2020, NEBHE, in collaboration with Maguire Associates, administered a survey to adult learners currently living in New England who were over the age of 25 and had achieved a minimum education level of a high school diploma or GED, but did not hold a Bachelor's degree. We received 2,031 valid responses from a sample representative of the populations of the six New England States. Here is what we discovered about New England adults' experiences with higher education.

• Massachusetts: 959 (47%)


• Connecticut: 490 (24%)

• Maine: 173 (9%)


• Rhode Island: 146 (7%)

• Vermont: 87 (4%)




HIGHER EDUCATION EXPERIENCE

What is the highest level of education you have completed?




How many prior college or university credits have you earned?
