Call for Proposals

Open Education Program – OER Creation or Adaptation Program

Opportunity

Open Educational Resources (OER) help reduce barriers to learning in postsecondary educational spaces, and while many high-quality, peer-reviewed resources have been developed and shared over the years, faculty continue to share that gaps still exist. That's why the New England Board of Higher Education (NEBHE) is awarding several grants of up to \$5,000 to faculty (individuals or teams) from any of the six New England states to support the creation or significant adaptation of OER.

Have you been curious about publishing your own OER because you just can't locate one that fits the bill? This is a great opportunity to help reduce financial barriers to a high-quality education for students while also contributing to the scholarly community – and get compensated to do so! Applications that prioritize high-enrollment subjects are strongly encouraged to apply.

Details

This opportunity is open to any faculty member (full or part-time) affiliated with an accredited two- or four-year private or public institution in the six New England states. If applying as a team, cross-institutional collaboration is encouraged, but not required.

Projects will be developed and hosted on NEBHE's [Pressbooks](#) account with light technical assistance. Priority will be given to projects that leverage and embed interactive assessments, simulations, or other means to thoughtfully engage students. NEBHE will also support the additional costs of copyediting and workshops for participants on topics such as accessibility guidelines, Creative Commons/copyright, and creating interactive assessments using [H5P](#).

Applications will open the morning of March 2, 2026 and close at 5pm on April 3, 2026. Notifications will be sent on May 1st, 2026.

Project start dates can be flexible but will be expected to be completed no later than October 30, 2026.

Applications that prioritize high-enrollment subjects are strongly encouraged to apply.

No prior experience with OER is required to apply, however, a commitment to knowledge sharing by publishing your final work under one of the following Creative Commons licenses is: CC-BY, CC-BY-SA, CC-BY-NC, CC-BY-NC-SA or CC-0. NEBHE is happy to help awardees identify a license that best fits their needs.

Funding Requirements

Individuals or teams receiving an award will be required to:

- Sign an agreement between yourself as the project lead and NEBHE.
- Attend Accessibility, Copyright, and Pressbooks workshops to be hosted virtually.
- Publish all OER produced through this program under a Creative Commons license.
- Use only awardee authored, Creative Commons licensed, Public Domain works, or Fair Use applications in your OER.
- Include all source and editable files used in creating the resource (including any multimedia files) to easily enable further remixing and modifications. Your copyright will remain yours.
- Share and celebrate your final product with the broader community through a NEBHE-sponsored free webinar and any other local opportunities on your campus(es).
- Commit to agreed upon timelines and deadlines.
- Work with the support and production teams as necessary to prepare materials for Academic Year 2026-2027.
- Teach with the OER developed through this project in your course(s) for a minimum of one academic year.
- Complete a Final Report.
