

Higher Education Legislation in the New England States, 2024

As of October 1, 2024 for the Legislative Advisory Committee

Summary

This document provides a list of higher education legislation passed (or, in the case of Massachusetts, pending) from the 2024 legislative session. It was produced in preparation for the New England Board of Higher Education's Fall Legislative Advisory Committee (LAC) meeting to support state legislators' knowledge of legislative efforts across the region.

Note: This report aims to summarize major legislative actions but does not contain an exhaustive list of all legislation pending or passed in New England.

Key legislative themes in 2024 included:

- Passage of interstate social work licensure compact agreements reducing barriers to social work licensure and increasing enrollment in social work degree programs.
- Establishment of student loan forgiveness programs for individuals entering certain highdemand professions, including health care, behavioral health, education, and criminal justice.
- Expanding in-state tuition and financial support to students with diverse immigration statuses.
- Supporting wrap-around support services on public campuses, including basic needs and mental health services.
